EASTER IS DECISIVE

'Christmas is important, but Easter is decisive.'

These seasonal words were apparently spoken during the 2002/3 Premier League season by then Arsenal manager Arsene Wenger, as

his club were chasing the title. His words were prescient as Arsenal would go on to lose the season to Manchester United (which tells you just how long ago this took place).

His words also speak of what I believe to be a deeper truth. If

you had to name our main cultural festival in the UK then you would probably say Christmas – family, turkey, presents, sprouts, etc. Easter, for many families, offers the chance to indulge in some oval shaped chocolate goodies, but beyond that, for many, it is just another weekend.

But for most Christians throughout history Easter is the sinaularly most decisive moment in our understanding of the world. Yes, Christmas is important. It is the moment Christians pause to remember the outrageous claim that the creator of matter, and antimatter, and space, and time, and DNA, and me, and you, choose to step into the world and become one of us homo sapiens. He became Emmanuel – which means 'God with us.' Christmas is important.

> It is Easter however which changes everything. The this moment when 'God with us' named Jesus moved beyond what could have divine been some factfindina fieldtrip, and died. Now, I know evervone dies. But he died horribly. Tragically

so do many others around the world today. But he, or so we Christians claim, died for us. Well, so do others to protect their friends, or nations, or beliefs. But he died in my place and that wasn't the end of the story. It is on Easter morning I remember that this 'God with us' rose from the grave. It is on Easter morning that I remember that somehow death and evil, my failings and mistakes, have somehow lost their grip on me. It is Easter that is decisive. It is at Easter that hope wins.

Now, I may be deluded. However, as my eternal hope as well as how I live my life in ways which try to run against my more selfish inclinations both hang on the plausibility of this claim, I have dug into this claim of Jesus' resurrection with every ounce of my limited intellect and I have found it to be outrageous, plausible and compelling. Enough so for it to be the event in human history which I am willing to gamble everything else on. I believe Easter happened. So I have hope even in my deepest despair. So the world has hope even in it's darkest moments. For 2000 years Christians have declared this hope amidst famines, wars, oppressive tyrants, pandemics, changing times and cultures, and the rise and fall of nations. So on April 20th I am going to church carrying all my doubts, fears, and uncertainties to declare that 'Christ is risen!' Wherever you are on your spiritual journey, you are very warmly invited to come along and join me.





A Hymn of Thanks



The German hymn Nun danket alle Gott (Now Thank we all our God) is loved by people all over the world. The words have been translated into many languages, and a number of composers have used the tune in their own works, among them J.S.Bach (5 works), F. Mendelssohn, J. Brahms, M. Reger and others, right up to modern times. Both words and tune were written by Martin Rinckart, a Lutheran pastor at the church of St Nikolai in Eilenburg, Saxony, the town where I was born and the church where my father was the organist as a young man.



Martin Rinckart lived from 1586-1649, a time when the Thirty Years' War raged through Europe, Protestants against Catholics, causing famine and pestilence

and leaving countries devastated and the population decimated. The armies advanced and retreated time and time again, demanding food and money for their soldiers, leaving the people impoverished and starving.

In 1639, the Protestant Swedish army advancing through Saxony came

to Eilenburg and demanded food and a large amount of money. The people had nothing more to give and although they were also Protestants, the Swedish general threatened to burn the town down if the required sum was not paid. The townsfolk were desperate. Pastor Martin Rinckart pleaded with the leadership, but in vain. So he called the parishioners to a special church service to pray for deliverance. Two Swedish officers attended the service and were moved by the plight of the people. They reported to their superiors that they believed the inhabitants had nothing more to give and the army moved on. Eilenburg was saved from destruction. A service of thanksgiving was held and they sang the hymn Nun danket alle Gott which their pastor had written for them some years previously, around 1630.

Y e a r s later a local artist painted the scene of the special



prayer service using people of the town as models, showing the Swedish officers listening to the service and Martin Rinckart praying from the chancel. The painting hung in the assembly hall of the local high school but was taken down during the communist rule in East Germany.

Luckily it was not destroyed, the caretaker hid it in the loft, and it has pride of place again in the same spot at my old school, which is now called Martin-Rinckart-Gymnasium.

Unfortunately, Eilenburg was not as lucky during World War II. At the end of April 1945, a few days before the end of the war, the American Army had reached the outskirts of the town. Everybody knew that the war was lost but the fanatical German commandant refused to hand over the town. The elders of the town council begged him to surrender, but he threatened to execute them for defeatism, and the ultimatum expired. I was 9 years old at the time. We sought shelter in the cellar of our house, the Kantorhaus, next to the vicarage and opposite the church of St Marien, the oldest church in Eilenburg, built on the Castle Hill overlooking the town.



The artillery fire continued for 2 days and nights. When the firing stopped, we saw below us the town in flames, an inferno.

90% of the town centre was destroyed. St Nikolai, Martin Rinckart's church, lay in ruins, and many lives were lost. It was the last German town to be destroyed, 80 years ago, on 22nd April 1945.

Our church of St Marien and the Kantorhouse had survived, it was a miracle. They were of course badly damaged: one pillar inside the church had collapsed taking part of the vaulted roof with it, and all the windows were broken. A rocket grenade went through the wall in my parents' bedroom and out through the window opposite without exploding, leaving just big holes. My father discovered an unexploded shell in his beloved church organ, and with my eldest brother he removed it carefully and carried it gently down from the organ loft, through the rubble in the church nave to a newly dug grave in the churchyard where it was later defused.

Hard years followed with the Soviet

occupation after the division of postwar Germany, but Eilenburg and St Nikolai have been rebuilt and St Marien renovated, and Martin Rinckart's hymn lives on. It



has accompanied me through my life, at my Christening, Confirmation, Wedding and other important occasions. For me it is both a hymn of thanks and a happy reminder of my home town in Germany.

Westcott Neighbourhood Development Plan – Westcott Village Forum

The second meeting of the Westcott Village Forum (WVF) was held at Holy Trinity on 27th February. The Forum is made up of volunteers from the village who will drive the update and review of the existing Plan. The Neighbourhood Plan gives our community the opportunity to create a shared vision for Westcott and set out a positive plan for development in the next 10 years. The Forum is supported by three working groups; Planning Policy (led by Ian Dunsford), Data Collection & Analysis (led by Chris Smewing) and Communications (led by Jo Astor) with Kevin Foo as Programme Lead. So far over 130 people from all areas of the village have volunteered to be part of the Forum, this also includes some of the businesses, groups and clubs in the village. Nearly 40 people attended the meeting.

When the current Neighbourhood Development Plan was put together it was greatly informed by a survey delivered to every household in the village with an amazing 85% response rate. This exercise will be repeated this time around and the Forum meeting also agreed that a professional Housing Needs Survey would be commissioned to inform the number and type of homes that are needed in the village in the development plan period. Timings for all this activity are currently being developed.

The target is to have a revised and updated Neighbourhood Plan ready to be put to a public referendum vote in the village by May 2026, to coincide with the Polling Stations being open for local elections to the new Unitary Authority for Surrey, so voting can take place at the same time. At least 50% of those voting for the Neighbourhood Plan need to vote in favour for it to be formally adopted. Roads and Pavements The WVA has been campaigning on highwaysrelated issues and we are very pleased to see a number of improvements including:

1) Hedge clearing by Surrey County Council (SCC) along the A25 to the east and west of the village has helped stop overgrown trees and bushes from encroaching onto the pavement.

2) Reclaiming the pavements - the



significant build-up of soil, weeds, branches and leaves is currently being cleared from the pavements stretching from Balchins Lane towards Milton Court

Lane. This is improving the usable width of the pavement and we would like to thank Hazel Watson for adding this work to SCC's 'Spring Clean' programme. Work is scheduled to be completed by the end of April. The large volume of debris that had collected on the pavement on the north side of the A25 opposite the Village Hall has also been cleared by MVDC.

3) Replacement fencing - SCC recently commissioned a

replacement fence near School Lane after the old one became unsafe. The raised section of pavement from School Lane to Corner Cottage now provides a safer



walking route along the busy A25.

Dialogue continues between the WVA, MVDC and SCC on a variety of subjects connected to road usage and a meeting took place at Pippbrook last month including improving road safety outside the school, how to potentially tackle the frequent traffic queues heading into Dorking and addressing the very poor condition of the pedestrian/cycle path between Westcott and Dorking. It is pleasing to note some positive progress taking place.

Building between the vines – the story of the Denbies LEGO house:



The Museum's current exhibition has been particularly popular with visitors. It continues through April but will close in May. It tells the story of how and why a full-size house was built of LEGO on the Denbies Wine Estate in 2009. It was the subject of one programme of a BBC television series, James May Toy Stories. 2009 marked the 60th anniversary of the first LEGO bricks being produced! The two-storey house took almost 2,000 volunteers to build over a five-week period, using over 3.3 million bricks and included furniture, furnishings, kitchen appliances, and even a shower, sink and flushing loo on the top floor – and a LEGO cat!

Specially designed Lego models of buildings and objects with a Dorking connection are on display, and a LEGO Dorking Cockerel trail around the Museum, with prizes, continues for the duration of the exhibition. At a special family activity in late February, 'Dorking in LEGO', families were invited to create LEGO models of Dorking features and buildings. The children's models have been added to the display in the Museum's front window for all visitors and passers-by to see until the exhibition ends.

But what exactly is stoolball, you ask?

Stoolball is an ancient bat-and-ball game often considered a precursor to modern cricket, played primarily Kent. and Surrey. in Sussex. А combination of cricket and rounders. it is a areat sport for women and the Surrey league have 9 teams. We also play other counties. If you can run, throw and catch a ball or wield a wooden bat, then it is the sport for you! It is a lovely way to keep fit and is verv sociable.

History of the sport

The earliest known references date back to the 1400s, when it was played in churchyards and on village greens. Shakespeare referred to the game in one of his plays and 'playing stoolball' was accepted as a euphemism for sexual behaviour! It is believed to have been initially played by milkmaids using their milking stools as wickets with a batter defending a stool using a wooden bat, evolving over time into a game with structured rules and competitive matches. Stoolball was associated with women, as it was one of the few ball games they were encouraged to play in medieval and early modern England. However, it was also played by men, and records indicate that even royalty, including King Charles II, showed an interest.



Today, stoolball remains a niche sport, with leagues and clubs primarily based in Sussex, where the game is a cherished part of local heritage. Modern stoolball has codified rules and is enjoyed as a recreational and competitive sport, preserving a tradition that has lasted for over 500 years.

December to May: PondNet Spawn Survey

March to May: FruitWatch

Help is needed in gathering information on when fruit trees are flowering, to understand how climate change is impacting pollination and fruit production.

April to October: Bat Sunset Survey No need for previous experience, just spend an hour from sunset (or before sunrise) with family/friends and discover bats and other wildlife in your local area. Let the Bat Conservation Trust know what you see.

25th April to 1st May: *Big River Watch* The Rivers Trust say that only 15% of river stretches in England are in good overall health. This survey invites people to take part in a simple activity to help build a picture of river health throughout the UK and Ireland.

More locally, the River Mole River Watch team of volunteers collect

water samples to test for pollutants and highlight areas of concern, with the aim of restoring our local river to a thriving ecological state.

May to October: Blackbirds in Gardens

The British Trust for Ornithology is appealing for people to take part in a survey to



record blackbird numbers across the UK. This is because birdwatchers have reported a decline in blackbird numbers in London, thought to be due to the mosquito-borne Usutu virus which has spread northwards due to climate change.

7th & 8th June: Pondwatch

A social-media campaign by the British Dragonfly Society in which they are encouraging everyone to get out and explore their local ponds and share photos and stories on social media #Pondwatch

18th July to 10th August: Big Butterfly Count



Butterfly Conservation's 2024 count raised the alarm on a big decline

in butterfly numbers and led to the declaration of a butterfly emergency. So this year's count is hugely important in determining how this key indicator species is faring.

All year: the British Trust for Ornithology has a number of other projects running throughout the year. Visit their website and look under the 'How You Can Help' tab to see current bird monitoring projects.

The UK Pollinator Monitoring Scheme

B e e s , hoverflies and other flowervisiting insects are vitally



important for pollinating food crops and are facing many challenges from pesticide use to climate change. UKPOMS has ongoing projects to improve understanding of how to best protect pollinators and restore their populations.
